You've heard us say it before - our staff mantra is, "We can do hard things." I often end all-staff emails with "We can do hard things - and you are." I am sincere when I use these words. Our clients do the hardest thing they'll ever have to do - safely leave a violent relationship. Our staff have difficult jobs, sometimes experiencing secondary trauma stemming from their work with families at SafeHaven.

But you - you are our *unsung* heroes.

2020 was a disaster of a year. At one point, I saw a social media post where the author was begging for an event to happen that was 'precedented'. We went into the COVID-19 pandemic with a surge in demand for services, and we were very fearful of a drop in supply of resources to support survivors. But y'all did a very hard thing. Instead of burying in the sand, you turned to SafeHaven and asked, "What do you need?" And when we answered, you provided again and again. 2020 showed us the goodness of people. You were also deep in the sludge of 2020, but you decided to give to survivors anyway. Because you saw a need, and you met it.

We don't think the needs in 2021 will be any less than 2020... possibly even greater (if you can believe it!). But now we know that our community - our heroes - will do the hard things. Because you already have.

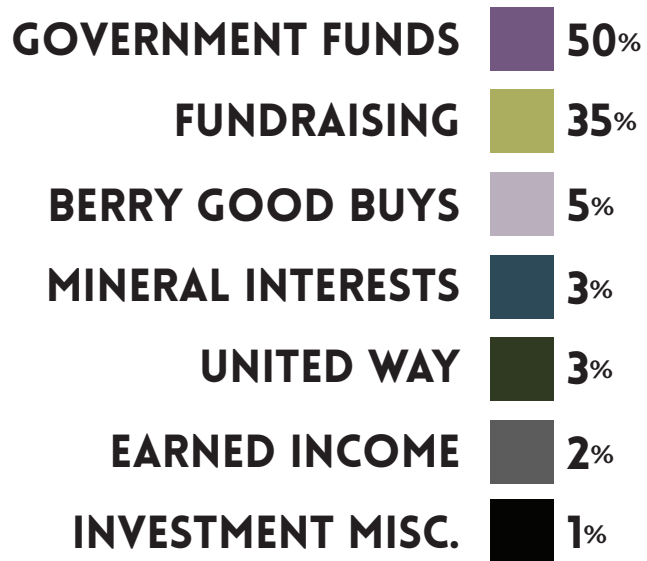
